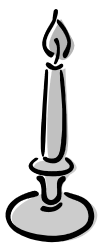

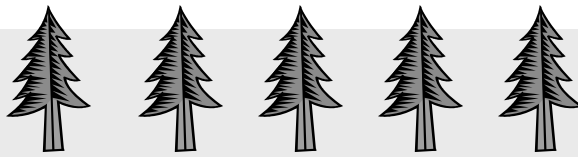

It will be very simple... **CAN YOU HELP????**)

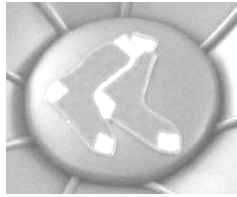
Congratulations to Sister Connie Messitt CSJ, director of

Feast of the Transfiguration

Dear Parents,

We centered our camp this week on ESP (Environment, Service and Prayer). We discovered we all had ESP in regards to the future of our Catholic Faith. Our Faith can continue to grow if we take care of the environment, take care of others, and make prayer an important part of each day.

Environment:

We talked about our responsibility of taking care of God’s Creation. We watched a video from Good Morning America, “The Great Pacific Garbage Patch”. This video talks about the remains of plastic which we discard. If you log onto YouTube.com you can find the video by entering the name of the clip. The fabric shopping bag they decorated is to be used to replace a plastic bag. They all want to make a difference to our environment by using cloth bags instead of plastic.

Service:

We washed the windows in the church hall and convent and moved rocks to help make the rock wall behind the convent. We attended the Communion Service at the Countryside Adult Home to help brighten up the day for the senior residents. We finished the week by taking plants with angels to the residents.

Prayer:

We used different forms of prayer and discovered that we all appreciated the time for silence and prayer. We painted prayer rocks and crosses to use as prayer tools. The campers agreed that a time for silent prayer is important for their spiritual growth. Please help them by letting them create a prayer space for their own prayer or also it would be wonderful to create a family prayer space. Perhaps a Bible could be placed in the prayer space and the family can read the upcoming Sunday Gospel each week. These can be found on many Catholic websites, so just enter Catholic Sunday readings in your search engine.

Thank you for giving your child a week for their spiritual growth. Please continue their faith journey by attending Mass and Faith Formation each Sunday. It has been a wonderful week not only for the children and youth helpers but for all the adults participating during the week.
