At the meeting last Wednesday, the Council continued to consider how we, as a parish, might become more conscious of our call to justice. An outline of the Catholic Social Teaching was shared and discussed. For starters, the Council decided to return to the lawn the sign that says "Respect Life." So that it is clear that we are not only concerned about abortion, but all life issues, it was decided to include "Womb to Tomb" on the sign. This is being worked out by Richelene Morey and John Cleveland. Diane Newell made the sign, originally. (Exactly where to put it is an issue.) Along the same vein, the council will invite to the August meeting, someone who can help us form a Justice Committee and help us decide what to focus on. Meanwhile, at the July meeting, an attempt will be made to create a calendar for 2012-13 so that we can peacefully plan ahead.

The following is a BIG decision with ramifications.

- **Fact:** the SAME handful of people do ALL the Fundraising at St. C's. They are getting tired.
- **Fact:** One reason our profits are what they are is because the people mentioned above not only spend all the time, but also in large part donate the "ingredients or goods." It is becoming expensive for them!
- **Fact:** The amount of work doesn't always result in a concomitant amount of income!
- **Fact:** Last year's Summer Breakfasts netted \$1200. We definitely need that money because, right now, with two weeks left in the fiscal year, we are DOWN \$9,500 in our Weekend Donations. (That is A LOT!)
- **DECISION: Breakfast without Breakfast!** Every household will be asked to "buy a virtual breakfast" at least once this summer. Maybe we can raise the money while letting our fundraisers rest.

Not a complaint... This is just an example:

Single handedly, Tom Dean (Summer Parishioner from Clifton Park) hauled all the garage sale items to the Hall, set it up, and worked the entire following day on the Sale. Tom will be back Tuesday to pack the leftovers, unless we can surprise him and do it beforehand. (Could you help? One Hour. SLH will help.)

WE SERVE
