BISHOP'S APPEAL Plus School Assessment = \$30,629.

To date, 105 households have pledged/paid a total of \$21549 to the Bishop's Appeal and 6 have pledged/paid \$370 to toward the school assessment. **\$21,919 out of \$30,629 has been pledged or paid. \$8,710 to go.**

These assessments are a parish bill. It would be terrific if the entire parish participated in the payment thereof.

Of the 193 households left, if you each gave \$1 a week toward this parish bill, we would not have to use the Sunday collection or savings. We need those for ordinary expenses.
