(We were instructed to put on four more coats to prevent winter snow/ice/water from getting under the tiles!) **Judy Rozell** will put on the the other four coats. **John Evansky** will cut and deliver the balsam for our Advent décor.

If you would you like to help in some way: Here are things that need attending to: Storm Windows need to be put on the Church (takes about 45 minutes, tops); The storms for the Convent porch need to be brought from the basement and installed (2 strong people, 20 minutes); the original church entrance needs to be winterized (20 minutes—see SLH); the entrance to the narthex basement needs to be sealed off (how to do this is still a mystery).
