**Topic for October 14, 11A-12N: "Protecting God's Children"**

It is mandated by our Diocese that each year our children receive help to recognize and deal with situations that threaten their well-being:

**Objective for 4-7 year olds:** To help distinguish the difference between good and inappropriate or confusing touch. To affirm a child's right to say no to an adult who makes them feel uncomfortable.

**Objective for 8-10 year olds** To help recognize the lures used by those who sexually victimize children. To give children strategies for keeping from being tricked into uncomfortable and dangerous situations.

**Objective for 11-13 year olds** To help youth recognize lures used by those who sexually victimize others via the anonymity of the Internet. To give young teens skills to avoid being victimized by internet sexual predators.

**Objective for 14-17 year olds** To help teens to set appropriate boundaries in their relationships with both adults and peers. To develop skills for addressing situations where boundaries are crossed.

**Adults** Not just parents, but all adults are welcome to gather and share concerns, disappointments, hopes etc. regarding the scandal in our church and now, in many other organizations thought to be "safe place" for our children. Present will be folks familiar with the legal end, the Child Protective Services end, and the Church. Bottom line: Let's talk about the elephant in the room!

**Virtus Training for Adults**

Virtus Training helps us to recognize child sexual abuse and teaches us what our responsibility is. At last week's Faith Formation Meeting, it was suggested that we have this very enlightening training here at St. C's. We are looking into it. (It is a requirement for any adult before they are allowed to teach, supervise, or even give a ride to our children. But more than that, the information is so valuable that the hope is that EVERYONE who has not already will participate. It is in the planning stages.)

**"Live a Life of No Regrets"**

This free inspirational event will be held at St. Clement's Church, 231 Lake Ave in Saratoga Springs on Thursday, October 18, 6:30PM. Robert Rogers is author of "Into the Deep: One Man's Story of How Tragedy Took His Family But Could Not Take His Faith."
