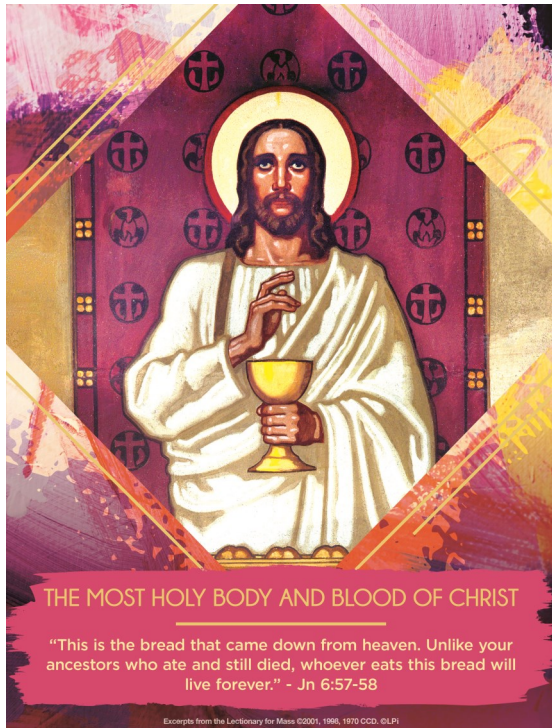

The Priesthood and the Eucharist

"These two Sacraments were born to-
gether," wrote St. John Paul II of the priest-
hood and the Eucharist, "and their destiny is
indissolubly linked until the end of the world."

The Eucharist is such a beautiful exam-
ple of how God, conscious of our limitations,
bends to meet us. He once came to us cloaked
in the flesh, that we might recognize Him.
Now He comes as the very means by which
we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the
most familiar and comforting thing in the
world to us. How easy He makes it to fulfill
his command that we become one with Him.
How generous He is to make such a sacred
thing also accessible.

We can say the same of the priesthood,
and of the men He calls to its number. How
generous of Him to make such an accessible
thing — our sons, our brothers, our uncles, our
cousins — sacred. How generous of Him to
allow these human creations — who share in
our own faults — to be the means through
which He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Without the Eucharist, we would have
no eternal life. Without priests, we would have
no Eucharist. On this, the Solemnity of the
Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let's
give thanks for our priests, and redouble our
prayers that God will send us good and holy
ones — manna from Heaven in our wandering
exile.

The Heart of Stewardship

What else is there to give when one has already
given away one's body and one's life? What more can
one say or do to demonstrate love for another when all
one had has been given to another? This total giving of
self to loved ones cannot be trumped by flowery words
or material gifts that are fleeting. This is the ultimate in
love. This is the love Jesus had for us on the way to his
Passion, at the institution of the Holy Eucharist. This is
the love he has for us daily in the celebration of the
Mass on altars in every church, in every city, in every
nation on earth. No one can give more. No one can ask
for more. This is the true heart of Christian stewardship.

If you take the time to gaze upon your God in
the simplest of forms and begin to reflect on what has
actually taken place with bread and wine becoming the
presence of the Divine, then you can begin to under-
stand true humility, sacrifice, and love. And when you
have the privilege to take that Real Presence into your
body at the meal where you are an honored guest, you
become one with the One who is the embodiment of
stewardship.

Then, you must ask yourself, "How can I even
begin to reflect the love that I have encountered at this
feast?" The answer is you can begin with the simple
actions of the day: where will you go, whom will you
meet, and in what work will you partake? Jesus Christ
has shown that the greatest gift ever given can be dis-
guised in this world in a piece of bread. By joining your
body to his, he can now transform human hearts, not by
grand acts, but by everyday acts, by everyday people,
practicing Everyday Stewardship.
